**PARISH NURSE NOTE: (from LCMS *Better Health*)**

*Till (an early) Death Do Us Part-* Research suggests that single people are more likely than married people to follow a regular exercise routine. A poll by the Department of Health found that only 27% of adults questioned met the recommended 150 minutes of physical activity per week, and of those polled, 76% of the men and 63% of the women were married. Researchers suggest that less exercise among married people may be the result of "letting themselves go" as they become more comfortable with their spouse.
