For Your Devotions From Lutheran Church Charities Your Answer Is—God!

If only I knew where to find him; if only I could go to his dwelling! Job 23:3

Job's troubles lasted almost a year. In that year he lost his children, his money, and his health. That's when he prayed, 'Oh, that I knew where I might find Him.' Notice, Job didn't pray, 'Oh, that I knew how to get back my children, my money, and my health.' He focused on none of those things. He realized that when you are in right standing with God, all the rest will fall into place. Here's a truth you learn when you lose what you love: when you've nothing left but God, you discover that God is enough! Much of the book of Job is about him arguing with God and complaining about his lot in life. Are you doing that? If you are, don't worry. God can handle it. As long as your eyes are on Him, He can correct you, teach you, help you, and cause you to grow stronger in faith. Job wasn't privy to what had gone on behind the scenes. He didn't know that a discussion had taken place between God and Satan in which Satan said, 'If You strip Job of all he has, he will curse You' (Job 1:11). But God knew differently, so He allowed Satan to attack Job for a season. When it was over, God hadn't changed His mind about Job and Job hadn't changed his mind about God. The only one who had changed his

mind was Satan! If you're wondering how the story ends: 'The Lord blessed the latter days of Job more than his beginning' (Job 42:12). So if you're in trouble today, your answer is-God. Keep trusting Him and He will bring you through victorious!

Buried in the middle of the Old Testament is a great passage describing King David's preparations for the building of the temple in Jerusalem by his son Solomon. It is a wonderful description of what stewardship truly is, living a life of joyful faith and generous giving. We continue our previous months' studies with more passages from 1 Chronicles 29:

Verse 21: The next day they made sacrifices to the Lord and presented burnt offerings to Him: a thousand bulls, a thousand rams and a thousand male lambs, together with their drink offerings, and other sacrifices in abundance for all Israel.

Verse 22: They are and drank with great joy in the		
presence of the Lord that day.		
Great celebrations usually involve some type of eating		
and drinking. We could say that God's ancient people		
proved that they were Lutherans because when they go		

together there was food and drink!

From the Pastor's Desk

For as long as I can remember, I knew that I was adopted. Of course, I knew my birthdate. I also knew that I was born in St. Louis. Later, my parents told me that my birthmother was studying to be a nurse and that my birthfather was studying to be a doctor. They were young and unmarried. I knew my birthmother's name. About ten years ago I found out that I was born at Booth Hospital in St. Louis.

I never tried to find my birthparents, certainly not while Mom and Dad were living. They said it would have been fine with them, but I would have considered it a slap in their faces. They did great for me, so I had no desire to look for any other parents. One drawback to being adopted is not having any medical history. Every new doctor I go to wants to know and all I can say is "I'm adopted and don't know any medical history."

Though I was not looking for my birthparents, I was not opposed to finding them either. I figured that some day it would happen but it still shocked me when it did. My best friend growing up, John, now lives in St. Louis. He called me at the end of April and said he needed to talk to me in person and right away. I cleared the calendar for that evening and drove across the river to meet him. Knowing of my story, he was always interested in adoptions. He said that he had followed a thread on the Internet and found my birthmother. He felt that perhaps he had been snooping in on my life, but I assured him that this was God's timing.

My birthmother's name is Kathleen. She lives in Shreveport, Louisiana. She had signed up on a number of adoption registries in an attempt to find me. John had found some pictures and even some Facebook posts. What convinced me to contact her was this post, exactly a month after my Mom died: "I have been a birthmom for 48 years and believe the hurt gets worse each year. Have been searching for so long and on so many registries. Closed and sealed adoptions in Missouri are just difficult. I tell myself that my son is happy with his life instead of he might no longer be alive or that he feels unloved by me. I have put it in the Lord's hands."

I wrote her a letter anonymously hoping that she would get it in time for Mother's Day. I had always told myself that if I ever met her I would simply say "Thanks, you did the right thing." However, in good preacher fashion my letter said a lot more just to assure her that I have had a good life. I offered to contact her through her pastor so that she would have pastoral care at this time. After a couple weeks we did get to have a phone conversation. I also have a half-sister, Leslie, who is two years younger and a half-brother, Jimmy, who is six years younger.

Cindy, Mary and I made a quick trip to Shreveport in August to meet them. It was a very good visit. I hope that when our other children have a break from school, all of us can make another trip back there. My birth grandmother is still living at age 96 (she actually was younger than my adopted father!). The first thing she said to me was "I have been praying for you for 51 years." We never know who is lifting us up in prayer.

We have had a wonderful start to the new school year! Lots of anticipation and excitement surrounded the new addition. Many "home visits" took place in the classrooms to see where the students would need to go on the first day of school! Our enrollment is 179 in K-8, Preschool-37, and Daycare-65. Our total is 281! We are thankful for all the children we have to hear God's word each and every day!

Thank you to the many hands that helped get the school ready for the start of school. Two weeks before school started it did not look like we could possibly have everything ready. Construction dirt and dust was everywhere and the gym was still full of stuff from everywhere else! As the floors were being finished, little by little, we were able to start moving classrooms back into place. The parking lot was completed after a short

strike. The kitchen basically was finished but we had to clean and move everything back in place. The offices were moved and the new lock and security system was tested and implemented. The phones were reconnected as well as the security cameras. Activity in the building and outside was in a constant state of motion! And, with everyone's help, the job was completed!

The students are excited to be in the new building addition. The Junior High students are happy in their new classrooms. Unfortunately, the new lockers will not be installed till later in September and the new desks did not arrive till today, but I think the students were still happy to be in the new classrooms anyway. Many thanks to Todd Birkner, Byron Falkenhain and Pastor Koen for helping to unload the desks. They just happened to be in the area and offered to help! (I think I really pleaded with them!) Our younger students, grades 3 and 5, got to move into classrooms with lockers! This was a new experience for them! Mrs. Schmitz and Mrs. Letcher have newly painted walls and our Preschool moved back to the Early Childhood wing with an updated classroom as well. The library looks wonderful and now we have moved to an electronic digital system for checking out the books! Mr. Becker had a very dedicated group of people help him get the library ready for the new school year. Our before and after school care now has a room situated by the cafeteria for their use. As all the projects were completed, the building looked like it was ready for school!

What still needs to be done? The music area will need to be remodeled from our old office space. The gym should have the basketball goals and flooring completed by the third week of September. The east door of the school is having a new ramp and steps being poured as I am writing this article. The playground plan is complete and all the equipment will be reinstalled in September. I know the students are really looking forward to having their playground back! A design and plan for the Donation Wall is being worked out and it will not be long before this project is complete. Of course, there are other odds and ends but we are so happy to be as far as we are with the expansion project! To God be all the glory!

Baseball and softball are under way. The 8th grade will have a BBQ on September 13. Mums will once again be sold by the 8th grade and their rummage sale will be October 2 and 3. We will celebrate Grandparent/Special Guest day on Sept. 25 in the morning. Please watch for more information in the bulletin or newsletter.
