### **GRIEVING PASTOR OFFERS HELP TO THOSE WHO GRIEVE**

Rev. Steven Massey, author of *Songs from the Pit*, will talk about his book Monday, July 10, at 7:30 p.m. at St. John’s Lutheran Church, New Minden. Those who attend will hear about the author’s own grief journey and his attempt to give grief a voice; he will also leave time for questions. Refreshments will be served.

*Songs from the Pit* is a month-long devotional for those dealing with grief and depression. He began his grief walk when his wife died suddenly from a brain aneurism. Riddled by the consequences of complicated grief, one sleepless night, Massey made a commitment, “I will give grief a voice.”

Most recently Pastor Massey worked as a chaplain for a hospice agency. He had stepped down as associate pastor due to complicated grief and needed some time to heal. He used that time to write the book, *Songs from the Pit*. This is a devotional for those who are grieving or depressed. Massey believes that the Lord used his time of grief to give grief a voice for those who are grieving.

Rev. Massey has served as a pastor in the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod for over 25 years. While in the seminary he served for a year as a vicar (intern) in Guatemala and after graduation was sent as a missionary to Jamaica. He has also served churches in Detroit, Peoria, New York City, Chicago, Phoenix, and St. Johns, Michigan.

The public is invited to hear Rev. Massey for this stop on his book tour. He says, “Grief may be your reality, but it does not have to have the final word.”

HEARING AND VISION ASSISTANCE: See an usher if you would like to check out a hearing assistance device during our worship service. You can sit anywhere you wish while wearing this device. WE CELEBRATE HOLY COMMUNION: In this Supper of our Lord we receive the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the earthly forms of bread and wine for the forgiveness of our sins and the strengthening of our faith. Since this Holy Communion is also a sign of how we commonly confess the Christian faith, we welcome to the Lord's Table those who are confirmed members of congregations of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. The individual cups of white wine in the center of the cup tray contain non-alcoholic wine for those who prefer this. Place a finger to your lips if you prefer an individual cup.
