“Stand on God’s Word”

*The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those
who are crushed in spirit. Psalm 34:8*

When someone has broken your heart. When somebody you love breaks your heart and betrays your trust, you’re in a vulnerable place. And the enemy will use the experience to get you to do four things that will hurt you even more, derail you spiritually, and rob you of God’s blessing: 1) Isolate yourself, alienate and avoid others. 2) Lose your sense of trust and suspect the motives of everyone you meet. 3) Cause a root of bitterness to spring up that will impact your relationship with your family and those in your circle of influence (see [Hebrews 12:15](#)). 4) Make you strike back and get even, rendering evil for evil (see [1 Thessalonians 5:15](#)). Don’t do it!

Instead, stand on God’s Word: *‘The Lord is close to the broken-hearted; he rescues those whose spirits are crushed.’ ‘I will turn their mourning into joy. I will comfort them and exchange their sorrow for rejoicing’ (Jeremiah 31:13). ‘The Spirit of the Lord...has anointed Me to preach the gospel to the poor...heal the broken-hearted...proclaim liberty to the captives...recovery of sight to the blind, to set*

at liberty those who are oppressed’ (Luke 4:18). ‘Get rid of all bitterness, rage, anger, harsh words, and slander, as well as all types of evil behavior. Instead, be kind to each other, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, just as God through Christ has forgiven you’ (Ephesians 4:31-32). Has someone done you wrong? Forgive them – and keep on forgiving them until you’re free in your mind. It’s a daily walk that sometimes feels like three steps forward and two back. But if you keep your eyes on Jesus – you’ll get there.

Prayer- Heavenly Father, help me to forgive those who have hurt my heart. Help me to keep forgiving and to heal, by Your strength, my heart. In Jesus’ name. Amen.

As we prepare for the celebrations of Thanksgiving, let us give thanks continually for all that we are and all that we have because of God's daily care. May we be all the more diligent in bringing everything that we have received from God to Him, so that He may bless it and employ it for the good of all – even for us. For to the one who has, more will be given, and he will have an abundance.
