### **From Lutheran Hour Ministries**

And it was love at first sight for them. You told yourself and anyone else listening, "We're not getting a new dog today, only going to the animal shelter to look." How long did that last? A minute after you walked into the shelter and saw the dogs lined up, there was Kylie, a black lab with the kindest eyes you ever saw. She looked at you, and everything about that look said, "You're going to take me home, aren't you?" It was love at first sight. And yes, of course, 30 minutes later you were walking out of the shelter with the cutest, nicest black lab that ever lived. And by the way, this is a true story, and Kylie really was the best dog we ever had.

Does love at first sight really happen? Could love at first sight be more than just a black lab at the animal shelter?

Our text today from Genesis 29 describes how Jacob first saw Rachel. It was love at first sight and a love that lasted. It's a wonderful story full of their love

as they waited seven years before they could marry. Jacob and Rachel had a thrilling start to their relationship. Unfortunately, after seven years of waiting, their wedding day didn't turn out as they expected. In a strange twist, Jacob married Leah, Rachel's sister, that day. And while every wedding has something that goes wrong, marrying the wrong person takes trouble to a new level. After seven days Jacob and Rachel did get married, and the whole, long, complicated story of their married lives began. Is that how our lives will turn out? Are we hoping for someone to love us at first sight? But then are we nervous that, somehow, no matter how well love starts, it won't end well?

Something will spoil our plans. It might be love at first sight, but soon it'll be love lost. The good news with God is that He has loved us from His first sight of us and He'll never stop. He knows our lives, every high and low, and none of that has changed the love He has had for us from before the world began. He has formed us with love, and His love has watched over us every day. He doesn't hide our sins from His sight. He cleanses us of our sins and sees us as a perfect bride, as He is a perfect Bridegroom. Because of His forgiveness that comes every day, His love lasts. God holds us perfectly in His love. How could He ever lose His hold on us?

Jesus said in John 10:28, "I give them eternal life, and they will never perish, and no one will snatch them out of My hand." In His firm hand, we're safe. No disaster, no change of our earthly plans can tear apart our relationship with Him. He has chosen us as his own, and His choice stands for all time. So, love at first sight really does exist. It might be waiting for you at the animal shelter. You're certainly smarter than I was. You know if you walk into that shelter you're probably walking out with the best dog you ever had. You're going to the animal shelter for love at first sight.

And isn't it wonderful? We have a greater love given us by God. He doesn't choose just one of us. He's come to love and save the world. His love is love for all time. His plan to save us has already been fulfilled by the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. Now He lives to gather us together with Him, to walk with Him

each day, and to know His love. The love of Jesus is love at first sight, love that lasts.

**WE PRAY:** Heavenly Father, thank You for loving us from before the foundation of the world. Continue to show us Your love and assure us that Your love will bring us to eternal life with You. We pray in Jesus' Name. Amen.

### **Your Pastors' Ponderings**

Greetings in the Name of Jesus Christ,

I hope this month's Newsletter finds everyone doing well. As we begin the Month of October, I feel the pull this month to talk about one single word. It is a single little five-letter word known as FAITH. It is an important word for us as Christians to know and understand. It is a word that when we think about it causes many people to wonder about FAITH. They ask themselves what is FAITH? Do I have enough FAITH? Do I have too much FAITH?

To begin with, let us start with a basic definition of FAITH. FAITH is "a complete trust or confidence in someone or something." However, let us improve on that definition with a more substantial and biblical meaning of the word. The Book of Hebrews 11:1-3 states, "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. 2 For by it the people of old received their commendation. 3 By faith we understand that the universe was created by the word of God, so that what is seen was not made out of things that are visible" (ESV).

So, what do you think? Do we have enough Faith? The answer would be "No ... or is it Yes?" No, because we consistently sin and fall short of the Glory of God. We can never have enough or complete FAITH. First, because we always doubt things. We may have faith in something at first, but a moment later, we allow doubt to seep into our thinking and cause us to wonder. Second, because we have nothing to do with FAITH. It is not something we can earn. It is something we receive as a gift from the Holy Spirit.

We could also look at the question, "Do we have enough FAITH," with an answer of yes. This is because it has nothing to do with us. It is completely, thankfully, out of our hands. It is a free gift from the Holy Spirit given to us in Baptism and/or through hearing the Gospel. When the Holy Spirit provides us

with the gift of FAITH, then we can have FAITH in Christ, but not before. In receiving FAITH from the Holy Spirit, certainly, He would not provide us with a lack of FAITH. Therefore, the FAITH provided by the Holy Spirit must surely, provide us with enough. However, what gets in the way, is our humanness. It causes us to wonder or second guess whether or not we have enough FAITH.

To comprehend FAITH, we must know, and understand, that Faith trusts in Jesus Christ and Him crucified and not in itself. We do not trust in ourselves to save us; we do trust in Jesus to save us. A way of knowing and understanding FAITH is to replace the word "Jesus" with "FAITH." So, your FAITH has saved you; your Jesus has saved you. It is said that when one finds the words FAITH and Jesus to be interchangeable, then they are thinking correctly about faith.

### ATTENTION PLEASE:

At the July Voter's it was voted on and approved to increase the amount the St. John's treasurer can request to **borrow** from the Estate Fund Committee. It was approved to increase the amount from \$100,000 to \$200,000. Currently, we have borrowed all \$200,000 that is available. Again, these funds are borrowed, **NOT AS A GIFT**, but as a loan that needs to be repaid. These funds were borrowed due to the increase in expenses so we could **make payroll**. We are looking at ways to solve this issue. **St John's needs your help to secure our future as a church and school.**

### LCMS Stewardship Ministry

#### *The Singing Church*

Lutherans have historically been called "the singing church." There is no doubt that music has been a major component in the theology and practice of the Lutheran church. Luther once remarked about music, "We can mention only one point, namely, that next to the Word of God, music deserves the highest praise."<sup>1</sup> Music has a power and purpose that cannot be understated in our worship and the life of the congregation.

But music does more than touch the emotions. Music is a vehicle that carries both the musician and the hearer deeper into connection with the truth of the Scriptures. This is true of the most complex Bach chorale and even the simplest of songs like "Jesus Loves Me, This I Know." Each musical selection within the church shapes the thoughts, minds and faith of the people who experience them.

This is also true of stewardship hymns. We are currently considering the verses of "Forgive Us, Lord, for Shallow Thankfulness" (LSB 788) as it shapes our understanding and practice of stewardship. This month we take a deeper dive into verse two:

Teach us to thank you, Lord, for love and grace  
For life and vision, for a purpose clear,  
For Christ Your Son, and for each human face  
that shows Your message ever new and near.

The stanza begins by touching on the truth of the Law. Thankfulness is not a natural posture for fallen humanity. For sinners curved in upon themselves, thankfulness for love and grace is something that must be taught. We are those who hoard and clutch. Our



confession of our shallow thankfulness highlights the need for us to learn thankfulness to God.

Thankfulness also points to what we are stewards of: love and grace! All the things we have traditionally called stewardship aren't actual stewardship. Rather, what matters is how we steward the one, true and only treasure: the love and grace of God revealed to us in the Gospel of Jesus Christ. So, all stewardship is stewardship of the Gospel! How can we gaze at the cross and empty tomb and not be thankful?

The LCMS defines stewardship as "the free and joyous activity of God's family — the church — in managing life's resources for His purposes." God's love and mercy give us a clear purpose as we live out our Baptism and practice this joyous stewardship. All we are, all we have entrusted to us, and all we are called to do is to connect others with the love and mercy of God revealed in Jesus!

The faithful steward sings with lips and life of this love and mercy that is ever new and near. In the Scriptures. In the Lord's House. At the Lord's Table. This is where our stewardship song starts and ends. Our family, our co-workers and classmates, and our world need to hear this song!
