PROCESSIONAL GOSPEL:

Matthew 21:1-11

P: The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the twenty-first chapter.

C: **Glory to You, O Lord.**

P: ¹Now when they drew near to Jerusalem and came to Bethphage, to the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples, ²saying to them, "Go into the village in front of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her. Untie them and bring them to me. ³If anyone says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord needs them,' and he will send them at once." ⁴This took place to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet, saying, ⁵"Say to the daughter of Zion, 'Behold, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, and on a colt, the foal of a beast of burden.'"

⁶The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them. ⁷They brought the donkey and the colt and put on them their cloaks, and he sat on them. ⁸Most of the crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road.

⁹And the crowds that went before him and that followed him were shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!" ¹⁰And when he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred up, saying, "Who is this?" ¹¹And the crowds said, "This is the prophet Jesus, from Nazareth of Galilee."

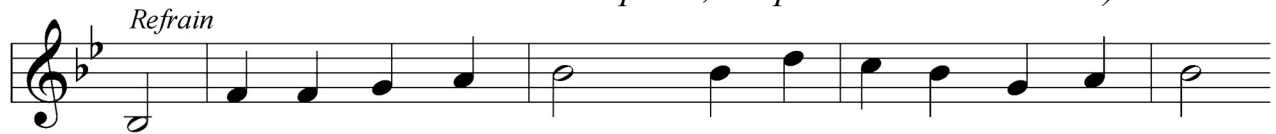

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION:

P: Loving Father, like those who greeted Jesus as he entered Jerusalem and later shouted, “Crucify him,” we are fickle people who often deny Christ in our thoughts, words, and deeds. Remembering the events of Holy Week helps us see ourselves for what we are, sinners in need of a Savior.

C: **O King of Glory, we confess that our praise of your majesty has often been faint, our performance as citizens of your kingdom has often been lack-luster. For we have surrendered to the enemy far too often. For our sin you died, Lord Jesus. For our restoration, you rose again. Draw us closer to you in this Holy Week, that our eyes may catch the vision of your love, and our hearts be captured by the wonder of your grace.**

P: God’s almighty power is shown chiefly in the weakness of Jesus—his riding upon a donkey on Palm Sunday, his bitter agony in Gethsemane, as well as in his bloody sweat on Good Friday. His resurrection assures you that his promises of forgiveness, life and salvation are all yours, now and indeed, forevermore!

ALL: I know that my Redeemer lives!

OLD TESTAMENT READING:

Job 41:20-34

L: ²⁰Out of his nostrils comes forth smoke, as from a boiling pot and burning rushes. ²¹His breath kindles coals, and a flame comes forth from his mouth. ²²In his neck abides strength, and terror dances before him. ²³The folds of his flesh stick together, firmly cast on him and immovable. ²⁴His heart is hard as a stone, hard as the lower millstone. ²⁵When he raises himself up the mighty are afraid; at the crashing they are beside themselves. ²⁶Though the sword reaches him, it does not avail, nor the spear, the dart, or the javelin. ²⁷He counts iron

as straw, and bronze as rotten wood. ²⁸The arrow cannot make him flee; for him sling stones are turned to stubble. ²⁹Clubs are counted as stubble; he laughs at the rattle of javelins. ³⁰His underparts are like sharp potsherds; he spreads himself like a threshing sledge on the mire. ³¹He makes the deep boil like a pot; he makes the sea like a pot of ointment. ³²Behind him he leaves a shining wake; one would think the deep to be white-haired. ³³On earth there is not his like, a creature without fear. ³⁴He sees everything that is high; he is king over all the sons of pride.”

EPISTLE READING:

2 Corinthians 12:1-10

L: ¹I must go on boasting. Though there is nothing to be gained by it, I will go on to visions and revelations of the Lord. ²I know a man in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know, God knows. ³And I know that this man was caught up into paradise—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know, God knows— ⁴and he heard things that cannot be told, which man may not utter. ⁵On behalf of this man I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except of my weaknesses. ⁶Though if I should wish to boast, I would not be a fool, for I would be speaking the truth. But I refrain from it, so that no one may think more of me than he sees in me or hears from me. ⁷So to keep me from being too elated by the surpassing greatness of the revelations, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to harass me, to keep me from being too elated. ⁸Three times I pleaded with the Lord about this, that it should leave me. ⁹But he said to me, “My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.” Therefore I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may rest upon me. ¹⁰For the sake of Christ, then, I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities. For when I am weak, then I am strong.
